Every year, about 10 million tonnes of plastic waste end up in the ocean. Oceans are now considered some of the most polluted places in the world. Over-fertilisation and over-fishing are pushing our oceans to the brink of destruction. Yet healthy oceans are essential for our survival on this planet, as a source of food, a climate regulator and a vital space for biodiversity. The need for action is enormous.

In our seminar, internationally renowned speakers will present realistic approaches to fundamentally improve the state of the world's oceans, with a focus on the Global South and in the context of the UN Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development (2021–2030).
